ROBIN ROBERTS

Co-Anchor, "Good Morning America" and Bestselling Author



Robin Roberts is co-anchor of ABC's "Good Morning America." Under her leadership, the broadcast has won numerous Emmy Awards for Outstanding Morning Program and the 2017 People's Choice Award for Favourite Daytime TV Hosting Team.

Roberts has been honoured with the Walter Cronkite Award for Excellence in Journalism, was inducted into the Broadcasting & Cable Hall of Fame as well as the Sports Broadcasting Hall of Fame, and named one of Glamour's Women of the Year. She was voted the "Most Trusted Person on Television" by a Reader's Digest poll in 2013.

Roberts founded her own production company, Rock'n Robin Productions, which creates original broadcast and digital programming for ABC and other networks, ranging from informational shows and documentaries, to live special events.

Roberts was diagnosed with breast cancer in June 2007, and five years later, she was

diagnosed with MDS. Roberts underwent a bone marrow transplant, her sister Sally-Ann was a perfect match. Her story triggered an outpouring of support from across the nation. She joined forces with Be the Match to inform the public about the need for more donors, and since her diagnosis, the bone marrow registry has seen a tremendous increase.

Her battle has been recognized with awards and honours from organizations around the country, including The Susan G. Komen Foundation and The Congressional Families Cancer Prevention Program. Roberts was also honoured with a George Foster Peabody Award and Gracie Award. Additionally, Roberts was recognized with the Arthur Ashe Courage Award at the ESPY's in July 2013 for the strength and courage she has displayed throughout her life and career.


Roberts was named co-anchor of "Good Morning America" in May 2005. She began contributing to the morning program in June 1995, and prior to that, she was a contributor to ESPN as a host on "SportsCenter" and contributing to "NFL PrimeTime." Roberts has worked in broadcasting for more than 30 years.

Roberts graduated cum laude from Southeastern Louisiana University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications. She was a standout performer on the women's basketball team, ending her career as one of the school's all-time leading scorers and rebounder. In 2012, Roberts was named an inductee to the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Roberts is the author of From the Heart: 7 Rules to Live By and her memoir, "Everybody's Got Something," in which she tells the story of her battle against a lifethreatening illness, learning life's hardest lessons, and her inspiring return to the GMA anchor desk.


Roberts is a native of the Mississippi Gulf Coast and currently resides in New York City.






DR. TASHA EURICH

Dr. Tasha Eurich is an organizational psychologist, researcher, and New York Times bestselling author. As a third generation entrepreneur, she grew up seeing the powerful influence company leaders had, on both their businesses and the livelihoods of their employees.

Dr. Eurich's first book, *Bankable Leadership*, debuted on the New York Times bestseller list, and has since become a popular resource

for managers and executives who don't want to choose between making their employees happy and producing bottom-line results for their business.

Her latest book, *Insight*, delves into the connection between an employee's self-awareness—what Dr. Eurich calls the metaskill of the twenty-first century—and their performance and success, both in and out of the workplace. Over the course of three

years, Dr. Eurich conducted a first-of-its-kind study, surveying thousands of people and examining hundreds of academic studies.

With a PhD in Industrial-Organizational Psychology, Dr. Eurich contributes to The Huffington Post and Entrepreneur Magazine and has been featured in outlets like Forbes, The New York Times, CNBC, Fast Company, and Inc.


Tiffany Dufu is a catalyst-at-large in the world of women's leadership and the author of *Drop the Ball*, a memoir and manifesto that shows women how to cultivate the single skill they really need in order to thrive: the ability to let go. According to foreword contributor Gloria Steinem, *Drop The Ball* is "important, path-breaking, intimate and brave."

Named to Fast Company's League of Extraordinary Women, Tiffany is Founder and CEO of The Cru, a peer coaching

service for women looking to accelerate their personal and professional growth. She was a launch team member to Lean In, and also served as Chief Leadership Officer to Levo, the fastest growing millennial professional network. Prior to that, Tiffany served as President of The White House Project, which trained women to run for office. Having raised nearly \$20 million toward the cause of women and girls, she's been featured in The New York Times, ESSENCE, O, The Oprah Magazine,

and on NPR. She is a consultant to Fortune 500 companies, a sought-after speaker on women's leadership, and has presented at Fortune Magazine's Most Powerful Women Summit, TEDWomen and MAKERS.

Tiffany is a member of Women's Forum New York, Delta Sigma Theta, Sorority, Inc. and is a Lifetime Girl Scout. She serves on the board of Simmons College and Girls Who Code. She lives in New York City with her husband and two children.

Her speaking portfolio includes two TEDx talks, as well as engagements with Amnesty International, ME to WE, Women's Business Network, and many major corporations, associations, and non-profits across North America and beyond. Her 2017 TEDx Talk was named an all-time top 10 talk on gender-based violence.


In 2017, Samra penned an article about her personal journey for Toronto Life which




